

Previous work experience

Prior to returning Spain, Miguel worked in several countries as Holland, Japan, France and United Kingdom for one of the most well known architects worldwide such as David Chipperfield (2015), Kengo Kuma (2010-2014), and Rem Koolhaas (2007-2009) awarded with the Pritzker prize.

His most recent experience has been collaborating with Duggan Morris Architects in London (2015-2016).

Miguel has also covered different cultural projects, being the lead architect of shortlisted entries as "National History Museum of Denmark in Copenhagen", and "Fine Arts Museum MCBA in Lausanne" during his period in Kengo Kuma & Associates. He was leading a winning entry proposal during 2 years for a Design built competition for a "Congress Centre and Philharmonic Hall in Angers, France".

Previous to his experience in Japan, Miguel worked in Rotterdam in OMA gaining experience in programs of varying complexity, such as "Cordoba Congress Centre", "PRADA Transformer Pavilion in Seoul," and "Taipei Performance Arts Competition" awarded with the 1st Prize.

After almost 10 years of international experience, he has established sukunfuku studio with Iria de la Peña.
